

BYLAW NO 3.

A Bylaw of the Village of Forget to compel the removal of dirt, stones, filth or rubbish off the streets, lanes or other public place within the Village.

The Council of the Village of Forget enacts as follows:

1. No person shall by himself or another throw, place, deposit or leave any dirt, stones, filth, dust or rubbish in any street, highway lane, alley or other public place in the Village.
2. Any person so doing shall, within twenty-four hours after notification by the Council, the Health Officer, health inspector or constable, remove such dirt, stones, filth or rubbish and place the same on the Village nuisance ground or other place designated in the notice; and, if he neglects or refuses to do so, the Council may order the removal at the expense of the party in default, and the Village may recover the expense thereof with costs by action in any Court of competent jurisdiction or in like manner as municipal taxes. The payment of a fine under section one shall not relieve the person in default from liability under this section.
3. Any person found guilty of an infraction of any of the provisions of this bylaw shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the general penalty bylaw of the Village.

Done and passed in council assembled and read three times by the unanimous consent of the Council of the Village of Forget in the Province of Saskatchewan this third day of May, A.D. 1927.
